The goal of Research and Development at Bolante.NET is to improve knowledge and spread practical information about disaster behavioral health, threat assessment, and suicide prevention with a focus on diversity and inclusion.

The research team has met every Tuesday morning this past year for an early morning Zoom meeting which brings together a vibrant collection of clinical and academic members, doctoral candidates, undergraduate interns, and instructors in the areas noted. The topics covered include progress on current projects/manuscripts and presentations from invited guests. In addition to the core group, researchers include an international collection of experts as needed for current and proposed projects. Of note is the exceptional research acumen of Drs Dykeman of Oregon State University and Ni of Western Oregon University.

2022 has been most productive for Research and Development, with one manuscript accepted for publication in an APA journal, two projects submitted for publication in peer-reviewed journals, one survey article in the final stages of editing aimed at a trade publication, and several projects in the development stage.
